The Bonds will be issued pursuant to the Revised Code of Washington, Chapter 43.180, for the purpose of financing and refinancing a nonprofit facility under Section 145 of the Code.

The Facilities will be leased to SIA and are expected to be operated by SIA and used for the operation of Washington public charter schools.
